- Felt like this class was fairly graded and had a fair amount of work without being too challenging.
- Maybe it was my expectations of what Polisci should be, having heard a lot of people talk about it, but I felt entirely underwhelmed. I expected to have my political views challenged and dissected and forced to view things through a different lens. Maybe I'm too old and too set in my views, but that didn't seem to happen. Instead, the entire class felt shoe horned into one specific path, albeit extremely subtly. It's mostly apparent in the writing assignments and the first arc of the class.
- I felt that the workload was adequate and well defined. I liked how the quizzes based on Chapter readings were online via Canvas allowing me time at home study over them for future tests in the course. As for the tests in class, I had no trouble with them. That is just what I believe, I could be wrong in that, but Giovanni is more than welcome to continue using it for future POLS 101 classes.
